Welcome back!

We hope that you have had a wonderful Summer and are looking forward to returning to school shortly. We are so excited to welcome Year 1-Year 6 back to school on Tuesday 2nd September at 8:45am. Nursery and Reception families have received separate details with separate staggered dates within your welcome packs to support with transition. Please contact our Early Years team if any of this is unclear.



New classrooms

Many of our classrooms have changed for September and therefore the children will arrive at and be dismissed from different doors. A number of our staff will be available on the playground to greet the children and we will also have signs displayed on doors and windows. The children visited their new classrooms at the end of last term and as such, should be confident with where they are going.

Uniform expectations

School Uniform

Adhering to the school uniform policy is important to maintain a sense of unity and pride within our school community. Parents are requested to provide a simple school uniform and are asked to support the school by ensuring that uniform is worn throughout the child's time at Corinthian Primary. They should always attend school neatly and tidily dressed.

Below are the guidelines for our school

Autumn and Spring Terms

- White shirt
- Navy jumper, cardigan or sweatshirt with or without school badge
- School tie
- Grey pinafore or skirt
- Charcoal grey trousers (short or long)
- **Plain black** school shoes or **plain black** trainers



ALL SCHOOL PE CLOTHING SHOULD BE PLAIN AND UNBRANDED.

WE WILL HAVE SPARE PE KITS, INCLUDING TRAINERS/PUMPS, IN SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN TO CHANGE INTO IF THEY ARE NOT WEARING THE CORRECT KIT.

- Children must come to school in their PE kits on their class PE or swimming day.

Shoes

We would like to remind you that pupils should wear black shoes only (no trainers). Nursery and Reception children must wear velcro or slip-on shoes please.

We have included some examples of acceptable/unacceptable footwear below.



Uniform expectations

Summer Term

- Yellow polo shirt with or without badge
- Navy blue jumper, cardigan or sweatshirt with or without school badge
- Yellow or blue gingham dress or grey pinafore or skirt
- Charcoal grey trousers (short or long)
- **Plain black** school shoes or **plain black** trainers



Hair: Long hair should be tied up with bobbles that reflect the school colours. Hairbands should be plain and also reflect the school colours.

Jewellery: Only simple stud earrings are allowed. A simple wristwatch may be worn, but smartwatches are not permitted. No other jewellery should be brought into school.

PE Kit

Physical Education is a vital part of our curriculum. Please ensure your child has the appropriate PE kit, which includes:

- **T-shirt:** plain white with or without badge
- **Shorts / Tracksuit Bottoms:** plain black or navy
- **Footwear:** Appropriate **plain black** sports trainers or pumps
- **Additional Items:** In colder weather, a plain black or navy sweatshirt may be worn.

Home Reading

Children have their reading books changed weekly; your teacher will let you know which day this occurs. Please sign and comment in your child's Home Reading Diary. All children must read 5 times per week and reading diaries will be checked on a daily basis to ensure that this is happening. Pupils will attend 'reading club' before lunch time each day if they have not read at home. This is not a sanction but to ensure that they are adequately supported with their reading.

Phonics

For children still accessing phonics, Read Write Inc phonic video links will be sent home. Please encourage your child to watch and join in with the learning.

Times Tables Rockstars (TTRockstars)

Children in years 3-6 will be given a login for TT Rockstars where they can practise timetables. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars regularly.

Century

This is a new platform that we introduced last year. Your child will be provided with a login and will be set 'nuggets' of homework to access.

Pupils will be awarded with house points if they regularly read and return their homework

New attendance reporting procedures at Corinthian



From September, you must notify our school office of your child's absence by making a telephone call on 0151-228-5806. We kindly ask that this call is made before the start of the school day. If our attendance team are busy on other calls, please leave a voice message, and somebody will call you back as soon as possible. Our team are available from 8:00am.

We cannot correctly record any absences without speaking with families directly over the telephone. App notifications are no longer accepted as part of our absence procedures. If medical evidence is required, this should now be sent via our new Arbor messaging service.

We are aiming for 100% attendance for every child and therefore our staff will encourage and support families to achieve this. Mrs Lovatt will work to support any families who need help with attendance.

Pupils must arrive at school at 8:45am to complete their 'strong start' activities. We close our doors and registers at 8:55am. Any children after this time will be marked late.
